

MDTA and WCA join forces

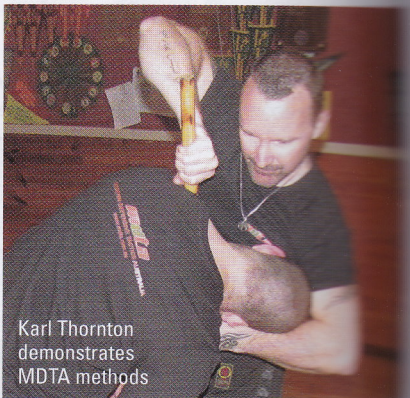
Melbourne-based Modern Defensive Tactics Australia has joined the renowned World Combat Association (WCA). Head instructor Karl Thornton believes the move to join the UK-based association will work towards establishing MDTA as a 'relevant and true' reality-based self-defence system.

Launched in 2008 by leading UK instructors Peter Consterdine and Geoff Thompson, the WCA was created as a result of the increasing demand of the legendary British Combat Association, an organisation that had produced many of the world's top unarmed combat instructors. For many years, overseas interest couldn't be satisfied by the domestic UK organisation, hence the formation of the WCA, where the benefits of membership could now be provided to those globally.

"Our philosophy and base structure is more related to the realities of the concepts and teachings of individuals like Peter Consterdine and Geoff Thompson," says Thornton.
